

# Horn of Africa Drought Situation Report No. 11 3 August 2011



*This report is issued by IOM Geneva on the basis of information provided by IOM Country Offices in the Horn of Africa.*

## IOM Ethiopia

- IOM Ethiopia has seconded to ARRA a team of medical staff to work in Dollo Ado.
- WHO Medical Kits and Oral Rehydration Salt (ORS) have been sent to the camps.
- The Regional Migration Health Assessment Coordinator will carry out a health assessment in Dollo Ado over the next few days.
- IOM is in the final preparation to carry out the movement of refugees to Hilowen camp in coordination with UNHCR who provides the daily manifest. Movement from Transit Centre to the Hilowen camp to get started on Friday.
- Two IOM buses have arrived to Dollo Ado, to supplement the local transport capacity for the provision of transport services. In addition to organizing movements from arrival points to the four camps, IOM has also been tasked by UNHCR to relocate refugees family members between camps as family re-unification process. Movement of refugees from the transit center to the camps (Hilowen, Melkedida and Bokolmany) in progress with a **total of 328 refugees moved** so far, including **133 family** reunification cases.

## IOM Kenya

- IOM will assist in the movement of vulnerable populations which will be initiated by a request of the Government of Kenya to IOM, UNHCR until which time the borders have been opened. In this arrangement IOM, in coordination with UNICEF and UNHCR will then transport vulnerable persons from the border area.
- IOM will focus assistance in Liboi, but will also assist those persons met traveling on foot from Liboi to Dadaab or in other locations as requested by the DC/DO Dadaab. These movements will be initiated the evening before relocation by a referral from LWF mobilization teams on the ground.
- A team of IOM Dadaab staff traveled together with UNICEF and Ministry of Health staff to Hamey the following day to assist the stranded migrants. The team provided transportation assistance to 51 families comprised of 178 individuals. They were relocated to Ifo and Hagadera refugee camps.
